Municipal Ordinance No. 11th-2-2025

AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING THE NATIONAL IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMINGAG, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it ORDAINED by the 11th Sangguniang Bayan of Dumingag, Zamboanga del Sur in a session duly assembled, that;

SECTION 1. TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Dumingag Mandatory Immunization Program Ordinance."

SECTION 2. RATIONALE

The Local Government Code of 1991 mandates local government units (LGUs) to deliver health services, aligning with the goals of Universal Health Care (Kalusugan Pangkalahatan) to ensure better health outcomes and equitable healthcare access. These efforts are essential to safeguard children's rights to proper care and nutrition and to promote health consciousness among communities.

In line with Republic Act 10152, the LGU of Dumingag emphasizes on the importance of immunization as a critical component of primary healthcare. By preventing life-threatening diseases and controlling infectious outbreaks, immunization programs protect the most vulnerable populations, especially children under five years old. This ordinance also seeks to strengthen the National Immunization Program, ensuring accessible and comprehensive healthcare for all constituents while addressing the unique needs of the underprivileged and marginalized sectors of society.

SECTION 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY

It is hereby declared that the municipal government of Dumingag, Zamboanga del Sur shall take proactive role in the preventive health care for infants, children, pregnant women, senior citizens and other vulnerable sectors in the municipality. Toward this end, it shall adopt a comprehensive, mandatory, and sustainable immunization program for vaccine-preventive diseases.

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SECTION 4. OBJECTIVES

This Ordinance aims to:

- a. Safeguard the health and well-being of children from all the forms of vaccine-preventable diseases through the full implementation of the National Immunization Program (NIP) in all barangays.
- b. Ensure that all parents, guardians, and stakeholders recognize the rights of every child to survival and full health development as an individual through full immunization.
- c. Develop mechanisms for data analysis, microplanning, systematic program implementation, and evaluation and training of health workers ensure success of the immunization program.

SECTION 5. DEFINITION OF TERMS

For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms are hereby used and defined herewith;

- a. Diphtheria - a bacterial infection caused by *Corynebacterium Diphtheria* involving the mucus membrane, usually tonsils and pharynx
- b. Epidemic - applied to a disease, affecting a large number of individuals in a community, spreading widely, and attacking many persons at the same time
- c. Epidemic Outbreak the sudden occurrence of disease in a community where the disease is never experienced before, or when cases of the disease occur in numbers greater than expected in a defined area
- d. Hepatitis B - a viral infections of the liver. Acute infection either resolves or progresses or can become a chronic infection which can lead to liver
- e. Immunization - the process whereby the person is made immune or resistant to an infectious disease by the administration of a vaccine to stimulate the body's immune system to protect the person against communicable infections or diseases
- f. Influenza - caused by a virus, mainly affecting the respiratory tract usually lasting from 3 to 7 days, manifested by colds, mild cough, muscle pains, and body malaise
- g. Measles - a viral infections characterized by cough, coryza or runny nose, and conjunctivitis, also with fever and rash, sometimes causing ear and brain infections
- h. Morbidity - the state of sickness or the rate of disease in population
- i. Morbidity Rate - the proportion of death in a population
- j. Mumps - sometimes called infectious parotitis, a viral infection primarily affecting salivary glands, usually affecting children 5 to 9 years old
- k. National Immunization Program (NIP) - a comprehensive health initiative aimed at reducing illness, disability, and death caused by vaccine-preventable diseases by ensuring the provision of free and accessible vaccines to target populations, particularly infants, children, pregnant women, and other vulnerable groups
- l. Pertussis - also known as whooping cough; a highly contagious, acute bacterial diseases affecting the respiratory tract
- m. Poliomyelitis - a disease of the central nervous system caused by the types 1, 2, and 3 polio viruses

- n. Rubella - an infection caused by a virus that can cause multiple fetal defects or Congenital Rubella Syndrome when contracted in the first trimester of pregnancy
- o. Tetanus - also known as lockjaw; cause by Clostridium Tetani Bacilli present in the soil and in the animal and human fees. It is often the cause of maternal and neonatal morbidity and mortality if and when material protection with tetanus toxoid is low and when umbilical care practices are not followed
- p. Tuberculosis - an infection caused by mycobacterium tuberculosis which usually attacks the lungs, but the other parts of the body can also be affected including the bones, joint, brain, and pelvic organs
- q. Vaccine - a preparation used to render a person immune to some diseases by inducing or in the natural immunity mechanism. Such preparations usually contain organisms that attenuated virulence or genetically engineered of the type for which immunity desired
- r. Vaccine-Preventable Diseases (VPD) - bacterial and viral diseases that can be prevented through immunization

SECTION 6. THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMINGAG IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM

The municipal government of Dumingag, through the Municipal/Rural Health Office, barangay health stations, infirmaries or hospitals and other health and nutrition facilities within the municipality shall adopt and fully implement the National Immunization Program in accordance with the guidelines of the Department of Health and other relevant laws and legal issuances.

SECTION 7. IMMUNIZATION COVERAGE

The municipal government of Dumingag shall ensure that all the target population for the immunization program shall receive recommended immunization against vaccine-preventable diseases, to wit;

a. Infants and children:

BCG	0 month to 11 months and 29 days
Hepatitis B	0 month to 11 months and 29 days
Pentavalent Vaccine (Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Hemophilus Influenza Type B, Hepatitis B)	0 month to 11 months and 29 days
Pneumonia Conjugate Vaccine	0 month to 11 months and 29 days
Oral Polio Vaccine	0 month to 1 year
Measles, Mumps and Rubella Vaccine	0 month to 11 months and 29 days
Meningococcal Vaccine MVC1	9 months
Meningococcal Vaccine MVC2	12 months
Human Papilloma Virus (HPV)	9 years to 14 years
Such other types as may be determined by the Secretary of Health in a department circular	

b. Senior Citizens

- 1. Anti-Flu Vaccine
- 2. Anti-Pneumonia Vaccine

c. Pregnant Women

1. Tetanus, Diphtheria, and other vaccines as recommended

All infants and children shall receive the mandatory basic immunization for free at the Rural Health Unit, other health facilities and other designated appropriate areas for infants and children up to 5 years of age. Parental consent shall be secured prior to vaccination.

SECTION 8. IMMUNIZATION PLANNING AND EVALUATION TEAM

An Immunization Planning and Evaluation Team shall be created and shall be composed of the following;

Assistant Team Leader

Municipal Health Officer (or DTTB as may be designated)

Members:

Chairperson, SB Committee on Health

LnB President

NIP Nurse Coordinator

BHW President

Representatives from Private Hospitals/Infirmaries/Clinics and Birthing Centers

Representative, Department of Education

Representative, MSWDO

Representative, Office of the Senior Citizen's Affairs

Representative from accredited Civil Society Organizations

Others as may be identified as necessary

SECTION 9. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Immunization Planning and Evaluation Team shall have the following duties and responsibilities, to wit;

- a. Prepare an Annual Report on the implementation of the immunization program including the plans, programs, services and activities, which shall be submitted to the Local Health Board for integration into the Local Health Plan of the municipality of Dumingag.
- b. Plan the implement strategies to enhance immunization in the Barangays.
- c. Monitor and evaluate performance on the implementation of immunization program in every barangay.
- d. Ensure the protocols and technical guidance for all immunization programs are communicated and properly implemented.
- e. Design and conduct trainings for health workers in charge of vaccine administration.
- f. Ensure proper logistics distribution plan for all Barangays.

SECTION 10. VACCINATION CARD

Every infant/child below five (5) years old must have a vaccination, containing details of the vaccines received, doses, and dates administered. The adult population who receives immunization shall be given appropriate vaccination cards.

SECTION 11. MAINTENANCE OF DATA BASE

The Immunization Planning and Evaluation Team shall keep an updated master list of the population to ensure the sufficiency and availability of vaccines. A database of vaccination records shall be kept and updated regularly.

SECTION 12. EDUCATION AND INFORMATION CAMPAIGN

Local consultations shall be conducted to promote public awareness of vaccination programs to address issues and concerns that hinder vaccine acceptability. All healthcare practitioners or healthcare workers who are administering prenatal care shall educate all pregnant women on the importance of giving their infants basic immunization services as well as any possible effects of immunization. Appropriate education and information materials shall be made available for distribution and dissemination to the public.

SECTION 13. OBLIGATION TO INFORM

Any physician, nurse, midwife, nursing aide or skilled birth attendant, who delivers, or assist in the delivery of a newborn shall, prior to delivery, inform parents or legal guardian of the newborn of the availability, nature, and benefits of immunization against vaccine preventable diseases.

SECTION 14. CONTINUING EDUCATION AND TRAINING OF HEALTH PERSONNEL

The municipal government of Dumingag shall undertake continuing information, education, and training programs for all concerned health personnel on the rationale and benefits of as well as modern procedures for immunization of infants and children against vaccine preventable diseases. Roll-out trainings shall be conducted on basic knowledge and skills in vaccine administration, vaccine safety, risk communication, management, and surveillance for adverse events following immunization.

SECTION 15. APPROPRIATION

The amount necessary to carry out the implementation of this Ordinance shall be included in the Annual Budget of the municipal government of Dumingag, specifically under the budget appropriation of the Municipal Health office. The amount shall have incremental increase annually as may be determined, to cover various expenses but not limited to the following, to wit;

- Logistics and supplies especially needles and syringes, gloves & PPE's.
- Monitoring, supervision and evaluation activities to include travel, per diems and representation allowances.
- Special/Mass Vaccination Campaign expenses for meeting, seminars, orientation, special gatherings and related events.
- Medicines for side effects and other related drugs.
- Other expenses categorized as LGU counterpart.

SECTION 16. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISION

The Municipal Health Office shall be the lead agency in the implementation of the Immunization Program.

SECTION 17. REPEALING CLAUSE

All ordinances, other orders and issuances, as well as pertinent rules and regulations thereof, which are inconsistent with any of the provisions in this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

SECTION 18. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If for any reason, any section of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid. Other sections which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 19. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE

This ordinance shall take effect after fifteen (15) days following the completion of the posting requirements in three (3) conspicuous places in the municipality of Dumingag.

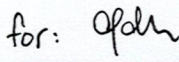
