Municipal Ordinance No. 25, s. 2018

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PREVENTION, CONTROL, REDUCTION AND MITIGATION OF THE MOSQUITO VECTOR OF DENGUE IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMINGAG, PENALIZING VIOLATORS THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled that:

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This ordinance shall be known as the “ANTI-DENGUE ORDINANCE OF DUMINGAG.”

SECTION 2. RATIONALE.

Dengue is a community-based problem and the most rapidly spreading mosquito-borne viral disease in the world and the number of cases has continued to increase and remains as a cause of mortality and morbidity especially in this Municipality.

The only identified viable method of controlling or preventing dengue virus transmission is to combat the vector mosquitoes through effective and efficient implementation using environmental management including the proper solid waste disposal and likewise, improved waste storage practices, including covering of containers to prevent access by egg-laying female mosquitoes (*Aedes Aegypti*, *Aedes Albopictus*).

The Municipality of Dumingag aims to continually and substantially reduce the occurrence of dengue cases through integrated vector management and implementation of prevention and control measures and strengthening the fight against it.

Even though the municipality strived hard to go beyond massive education campaign through household approach, there are still many constituents that do not cooperate.

Therefore, this municipality under the guidance of Genuine People’s Agenda, the program of government of Dumingag (*Municipal Ordinance No. 1, s. 2017*), requires all residents to strengthen the fight against the disease and to penalize those who will not cooperate; this is essential to the promotion of the General Welfare, health and safety under section 16 of RA 7160.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS.

The following terms are defined according to their use:

- **Aedes Aegypti** - a mosquito species that is totally black with white "spots" on the body and head regions and has white rings on the legs and a known main carrier of dengue virus;
- **Aedes Albopictus** - a mosquito species that is known as "tiger mosquito" and mostly the secondary vector;
- **Dengue** - an acute infectious disease caused by a flavivirus transmitted by Aedes mosquitoes, and characterized by a headache, severe joint pain, and a rash - also called breakbone fever, dengue fever;
- **Dengue Virus** - the cause of dengue fever; a mosquito-borne single positive-stranded RNA virus of genus flavivirus;
- **Establishments** - Dormitories, commercial buildings, lodging and boarding houses, apartments, offices, public markets, schools, colleges, church and other similar institutions;
- **Flavivirus** - any of a family of single-stranded RNA viruses transmitted especially by ticks and mosquitoes and including the causative agent of dengue;
- **Indiscriminate Fogging** - a process using equipment to deliver the insecticide in very tiny particles which drive away the mosquitoes to other areas;
- **Public Places** - camps, roads, cemetery, terminal, rest areas, and other open fields and enclosed areas of public assembly;
- **Pruning** - to cut off some of the branches of a tree or bush;
- **RNA** - Ribonucleic acid; a molecule essential in various biological roles in coding, decoding, regulation and expression of genes;
- **Stagnant Water** - a motionless water; not flowing in a stream or current. Also known as a standing water;
- **Vector** - an organism that can carry a disease-causing agent (like a virus) without developing the disease;
- **Vectors Breeding Ground** - a place where vectors lay their eggs for growth and development.

SECTION 4. REGULATORY PROVISIONS.

The following are the regulatory measures designed to carry out this ordinance, but not limited to:

- Municipal officials are responsible to lead the campaign of KampanyaKontra Dengue in disseminating dengue prevention and control activities;
- Barangay officials are responsible to contact owners of all vacant lots and abandoned houses in giving information to get rid of vectors' breeding ground;
- All household owners, administrators and caretakers of households, schools, tire trading/merchandise business and all other buildings/establishments within the municipality are mandated to get rid of vectors' breeding ground to eliminate mosquito larvae (waya-way);
- Buildings/structures under construction must not accumulate stagnant water and solid wastes;
- Uninhabited structures or buildings must be free from all kinds of waste and stagnant waters such as but not limited to abandoned swimming pools;
- All water drums, pails, similar containers must always be covered;
- All old or discarded tires should be punctured, cut or recycled;
- Unused tin cans, jars, bottles, pots, coconut shells and the like should be properly collected, stored, disposed or recycled;

- Gutters of roof must be maintained free from accumulation of rainwater;
- All plant vases and pots, open bamboo poles, tree holes, leaf plant axis, other natural or artificial containers that may accumulate water, should always be checked as the potential breeding place of *Aedes aegypti* and/or *Aedes albopictus* mosquitoes.

SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES.

- The authority of every school in the locality shall create an Anti-Dengue Brigade who shall monitor any signs of dengue cases among the students and immediately report to the BADCC or to the MHO;
- Public and private schools also need to conduct dengue prevention and control activities inside the schools;
- Church organizations and media are encouraged to assist in disseminating dengue prevention and control activities;
- Encourage households to do pruning of trees or bush, where vectors usually lay their eggs;
- Every household must observe proper waste segregation especially cellophane and plastics that are not properly disposed to prevent access by egg-laying female mosquitoes (*Aedes Aegypti*, *Aedes Albopictus*); and
- A stern written warning made by the Municipal Mayor thru MHO is given to all the household owners, administrators and caretakers upon random visitation of the committee, the 1st offense is penalized 3 days upon receipt.

SECTION 6. INFORMATION EDUCATION CAMPAIGN (IEC).

Implementing agency will conduct a massive public awareness campaign which includes but not limited to:

- Health education including the coordination and lectures and manners of destroying breeding sites;
- Participation in the “Kampanya Kontra Dengue” Activities; and
- Dissemination of all information such as but not limited to 5s: Search and Destroy, Self-Protection Measures, Seek Early Consultation, Say No to Indiscriminate Fogging and Surveillance to fight against dengue.

SECTION 7. CLEAN-UP DAY.

This municipality declares a municipal-wide activity, a “Clean-Up Day” which falls at First Friday of Every Quarter which requires all residents to cooperate and participate in cleaning up the environment in-support to fight against the occurrence of the disease.

SECTION 8. ENFORCEMENT AGENCY.

The provisions of this ordinance and its implementing rules and regulations shall be enforced by the Office of the Municipal Mayor through Municipal Health Office (MHO) with the cooperation of the Municipal Environment and Resource Office (MENRO), Municipal Planning and Development Office (MPDO), Municipal Youth Development Office (MYDO), Liga ng mga Barangay (LnB) and the Barangays concerned.

SECTION 9. CREATION OF DUMINGAG ANTI-DENGUE CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE (DADCC) AND ITS FUNCTIONS.

The Dumingag Anti-Dengue Campaign Committee shall be created and organized whose composition shall be the following:

9.1 FUNCTIONS OF DADCC:

- To formulate comprehensive policies, plans and programs and guidelines on the prevention and control of dengue and dengue outbreak, if declared;
- To formulate additional guidelines for proper implementation;
- To monitor the implementation and enforcement of this ordinance;
- To oversee and enforce strict implementation of the clean-up drive;
- To coordinate agencies or offices concerned relative to the information and awareness campaign against dengue to different barangays in this Municipality;
- To conduct public health campaigns, IEC, prepare activities throughout the year and make public announcements; and
- To report the data collected on dengue cases.

SECTION 10. CREATION OF BARANGAY ANTI-DENGUE CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE (BADCC) AND ITS FUNCTIONS.

The Barangay Anti-Dengue Committee shall be created and organized whose composition shall be the following:

10.1 FUNCTIONS OF BADCC:

- To conduct the monitoring and to record the dengue cases in the barangay;
- To encourage the implementation of environmental management in every household; and
- To assist the conduct of information, education campaign in the barangay.

10.1 FUNCTIONS OF BADCC:

- To conduct the monitoring and to record the dengue cases in the barangay;
- To encourage the implementation of environmental management in every household; and
- To assist the conduct of information, education campaign in the barangay.

SECTION 11. PENAL PROVISIONS.

Any person who shall neglect to comply with any of the regulatory provisions promulgated shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be meted with the following penalties:

- **FIRST OFFENSE** - A fine of one thousand pesos (P1, 000.00) or imprisonment of 3 months or both at the discretion of the court;
- **SECOND OFFENSE** - A fine of one thousand five hundred pesos (P1,500.00) or imprisonment of 3 months or both at the discretion of the court;
- **THIRD AND SUCCEEDING OFFENSES** - A fine of two thousand five hundred pesos (P2,500.00) or imprisonment of 6 months or both at the discretion of the court.

Section 12. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any portion of this ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other portions thereof not affected by such declaration shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 13. REPEALING CLAUSE. Any portion of an ordinance order or memorandum of local effect inconsistent with the provision/s of this ordinance is hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 14. EFFECTIVITY AND PUBLICATION CLAUSE. This ordinance shall take effect after the approval of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan and after fifteen (15) days from the date, a copy hereof is posted in the bulletin board at the entrance of the Municipal Hall and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places in the Poblacion, announcement in the local cable TV and FM station and further published in a local newspaper of general circulation once a week for three consecutive weeks, informing the constituents of the provisions and date of the effectivity thereof.
