Municipal Ordinance No. 4, s. 2022

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING DECEMBER 17 OF EVERY YEAR AS THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE OF ANCESTRAL DOMAIN TITLE (CADT) COMMEMORATION DAY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMINGAG, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR.

Section 1. TITLE

This ordinance shall be known as the “CADT Commemoration Day Ordinance” in the Municipality of Dumingag, Zamboanga del Sur.

Section 2. LEGAL BASES

Section 17 of Article 12 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution states that “The State shall recognize, respect, and protect the rights of indigenous cultural communities to preserve and develop their cultures, traditions, and institutions. It shall consider these rights in the formulation of national plans and policies.”

Republic Act No. 8371 otherwise known as the Indigenous Peoples Rights Act of 1997 - An Act to recognize, protect and promote the rights of Indigenous Cultural Communities/Indigenous People, creating a National Commission of Indigenous People, establishing implementing mechanisms, appropriating funds therefor, and for other purposes.

Section 3. RATIONALE

The municipality of Dumingag was created by virtue of Executive Order No. 283 signed by then President of the Philippines Carlos P. Garcia on December 27, 1957. Thirty five (35) barrios and sitios were segregated from the municipality of Molave, Zamboanga del sur and organized into a new and independent municipality. There are now, at present, forty four (44) barangays that comprises Dumingag, twenty four (24) of them are part of the Ancestral Domain (AD) of the Subanen Indigenous People of Dumingag.

Even before the creation of the municipality, the Subanens were recognized as the original settlers of the land. They were said to be from the coastal settlements and lowlands of the provinces of Misamis Occidental and Zamboanga. Other tribes of Malayan stock drove them farther inland. Some reached an area of what is now known today as the municipality of Dumingag. They cultivated the land and planted corn and other root crops

The Subanens organized themselves into a burgeoning community and established their own native political system headed by a Datu. Their recognized leader right before the influx of the Christians was Datu Nanking. Their seat of government was in Pangulayan (what is now called Maralag). His eldest son, Datu Otog lived in Timonan. His other son, Datu Bulan lived at Bato Sibuguey (Sitio Alegre). He also had a daughter who lived in Gitaran (now called Guitran). Datu Nanking had a nephew called Datu Barang who lived at Gulayan (now called Lower Landing). They had their own beliefs, customs and traditions. The arrival of the Christians in 1920's signals the gradual transfer of the Subanen communities further into the high lands. Today, the Subanen communities resides in their recognized Ancestral Domain preserving their own rich culture, beliefs and enjoying their right to self-determination.

In 1997, Republic Act No. 8371 otherwise known as the Indigenous Peoples Rights Act (IPRA) of 1997 was enacted. It gave the Subanen people hope that finally, the claim to their ancestral territories will finally be recognized. The LGU of Dumingag and the Subanen people work hand in hand to process such claim.

In December 17, 2004, the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) duly recognized, approved and issued a Certificate of Ancestral Domain Title (CADT) to the Subanen Indigenous People of Dumingag, cementing their claim to their ancestral land and for them to preserve for generations to come.

Section 4. THE SUBANEN INDIGENOUS PEOPLE OF DUMINGAG CERTIFICATE OF ANCESTRAL DOMAIN TITLE (CADT)

Section 5. SCOPE

This Ordinance is applicable within the territorial jurisdiction of Dumingag, Zamboanga del Sur.

Section 6. DECLARATION

The local government of Dumingag, in acknowledgement to the crucial role the Subanen Indigenous People played in the history of the municipality, in celebration of their beliefs, traditions and way of life, in recognition of the issuance of CADT which secures their rights to their ancestral land and as a memorial to the day their hopes and aspirations had finally become a reality, hereby declare December 17 of every year as the Issuance of Certificate of Ancestral Domain Title (CADT) Commemoration Day in the municipality of Dumingag, Zamboanga del Sur.

Section 7. PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

The following are the programs and projects designed to promote the rights, welfare and the advancement of Subanens in the municipality, to wit;

a. Increased capacity and participation of Subanens in reclaiming their rights and security

1. IP Leadership Formation/Trainings
2. Revision/Updating of Ancestral Domain Sustainable Development and Protection Plan (ADSDPP)
3. Re/orientation of IPRA Law - Republic Act 8371

b. Increased capacity and participation of LGUs and IP families in improving health conditions of IP families, children and women

1. Partnership building for health services
2. Training of women and health volunteers on Integrative Health Program
3. Programs on Indigenous Peoples - Maternal and Neonatal Child Health and Nutrition (IP - MNCHN)
4. Improvement of health facilities /Construction of Birthing Facilities and Waiting Home

c. Increased number of schools offering quality and culture-based and relevant education to children and youth

1. Improvement and maintenance of Dumingag Heritage Center
2. Training of teachers and facilitators on IP Education Program / TransEd Program
3. Promoted/Graduated IP learners and students
4. Monitoring of Children and Youth School Performance
5. Establishment and support of IP Community schools
6. Construction/repair of classrooms within the barangays of ancestral domain
7. Improvement / maintenance of Subanen Tribal Center in Tawhay, Brgy. Valencia

d. Established mechanisms on food security through sustainable organic agriculture and long-term crop production

1. Training of local agriculturists/ technologists
2. Establishment of Food Always in the Home (FAITH) and demo farms
3. Support to sustainable organic agriculture
4. Support to production and marketing of products
5. Support infrastructure projects such as construction of roads and bridges
6. Provision of farm tools and farm animals

e. Established sustainable livelihood opportunities through community-based enterprises

1. Management and financial literacy
2. Product development and marketing
3. Support to community enterprises such as provision of facilities and fixtures
4. Capacity building
5. Cooperative development, training and management

f. Increased capacity and participation of IP families and communities on environmental protection and enhancement/adaptation to climate change and in building resilient communities

1. Disaster Risk Reduction and Management
2. Agroforestry and reforestation
3. Establishment of water systems
4. Capacity building
5. Contour farming / Sloping Agricultural Land Technology (SALT)

Section 8. IMPLEMENTING AGENCY

The Office of the Municipal Mayor, Municipal Planning and Development Office (MPDO), Dumingag Organic Culture Office (DOCO) and Municipal Office for Subanen Affairs (MOSA) shall be the lead agencies responsible for the implementation of this Ordinance. It will be done in close coordination with the Subanen Indigenous People, Barangay officials and other stakeholders.

Section 9. BUDGETARY REQUIREMENTS

The Office of the Municipal Mayor together with the Municipal Planning and Development Office (MPDO), Dumingag Organic Culture Office (DOCO) and the Municipal Office for Subanen Affairs (MOSA) shall prepare the corresponding budget necessary for the successful implementation of this ordinance. The Municipal Budget Office shall see to it that the amount shall be shouldered by the municipal government in which this shall be reflected every year in the Annual Budget. The amount therefore, is hereby appropriated and shall be taken from the General Fund of the municipal government of Dumingag, Zamboanga del Sur.

Section 10. REPEALING CLAUSE

Any portion of an ordinance, order or memorandum of local effect inconsistent with the provision/s of this ordinance is hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If any portion of this ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other portions hereof not affected by such declaration shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 12. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE

This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.
