Municipal Ordinance No. 1, s. 2017

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE GENUINE PEOPLE'S AGENDA (GPA) IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMINGAG, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR.

Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled that:

Section 1. TITLE.

This ordinance is entitled, "Genuine People's Agenda (GPA)".

Section 2. GENERAL INFORMATION.

The Municipality of Dumingag was founded year 1957 of December 27th. It is a second class municipality in the Province of Zamboanga del Sur, Philippines. According to the 2010 census, it has a population of 50, 826. It consists of 44 Villages: 33 uplands and 11 lowlands, with a total land area of 61, 850 hectares. It is an Agricultural Municipality and is located at the heartlands of the Zamboanga Peninsula.

Section 3. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND.

Way back 2007, the Municipal Officials conducted a data gathering. Record shows widespread poverty. The 90% of population are poor, with low literacy rate, poor health services, slow economic activity and low income.

The Municipality of Dumingag strive hard to find a solution to answer the basic questions on how to liberate the people from poverty, sickness and hunger; how to bring the municipality to higher level of development and on how to provide brighter future for the people.

After a thorough discussion of the Executive, Legislatives, Community Leaders and Multi-Sectoral Leaders, the Municipality come up with a solution to the challenges, a product of a collective discussion and leadership, a comprehensive program of government, The Genuine People's Agenda (GPA).

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GPA serves as a guide and direction to every Dumingagnons to become disciplined, organized and determined to fight poverty.

At first, the program was born with 8 point agenda, years after the program became 15, then became 23 and now it composes of 27 point agenda.

Through continuous and massive people empowerment, the community understands and adopts the said program. The empowerment that equates genuine development. Communities were able to diagnose their social problems, identify priorities and plan out doable solutions.

Section 4. PROGRAM OF GOVERNMENT.

Genuine People's Agenda (GPA) is a comprehensive program of government of Dumingag, Zamboanga del Sur, consisting 27 point agenda:

1. Ensure Food and Nutrition Security

- Other cereals such as but not limited to adlai and sorghum.

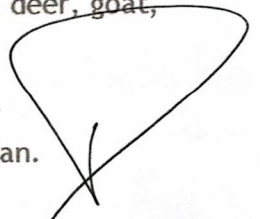
- Vegetables such as but not limited to kamunggay, tangkong, tinangkong, likway, alugbati, takway, saluyot, kulitis, udlot-gbi, kamote-bagun, bagu, pako, pechay, mustasa, lettuce, talong, okra, kalabasa, batong, patola, sikwa, karabansus, balantiyong, condol, pipino, sayote, tabyos, paliya, talong-pait, radish, ube, gabe, lutya, kuryuso, camote, palaw, patatas, carrots, biga, ongos, tabyos, tahure, prehores, patani, batong, baguio beans;
- Spices such as but not limited to sili, atsal, kamatis, luy-a, ahos, sangig, tanglad, sibuyas-dahon, sibuyas bombay, sibujing, paminta, biasong, tabon-tabon, roselle, limon, peppermint, rosemary, thyme, parsley, sage;
- Fruits such as but not limited to marang, manga, saging, pinya, santol, bayabas, caimito, avocado, durian, lanzones, rambutan, atis, tisa, balingbing, kasoy, iba, sambag, kahil, buungun, tambis, macopa, lomboy, kapayas, mangosteen, watermelon, Chinese melon, citrus, chico, dragonfruit, calabash, strawberry, gacfruit, grapes.

- ⊗ **Organic In-land Fishery** such as but not limited to tilapia, mudfish, catfish, carp, pangasius, gurami, poyo, kasili, pargu, bangus, anga, pigok, balanak, pait-pait, payi, kalong.

- ✧ **Organic Poultry Production** such as but not limited to native chicken egg production, native chicken meat production, quail, ducks, turkey, peking duck, goose, guinea fowl.

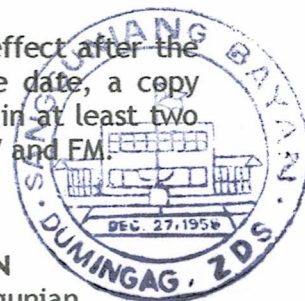
Section 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any portion of this ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other portions thereof not affected by such declaration shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. REPEALING CLAUSE. Any portion of an ordinance order or memorandum of local effect inconsistent with the provision/s of this ordinance is hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 7. EFFECTIVITY AND PUBLICATION CLAUSE. This ordinance shall take effect after the approval of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan and after fifteen (15) days from the date, a copy hereof is posted in the bulletin board at the entrance of the Municipal Hall and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places in the Poblacion, announcement in the local cable TV and FM.
